Burst.com Files Counter Claim Against Real Networks

Burst.com, Inc. (OTC: BRST) today announced that it has filed counterclaims accusing Real Networks of infringing five of Burst's U.S. patents. In the counterclaims, filed in Federal District Court in San Francisco on Monday, March 25th, Burst alleges that Real's software products infringe Burst's U.S. Patents 4,963,995; 5,995,705; 5,057,932; 5,164,839 and 5,963,202. Burst's filing responds to a suit that Real filed against Burst in January of this year, seeking a declaration that Burst's patents are invalid and that Real does not infringe them. Burst requests in its counterclaims that Real pay a reasonable royalty for Real's infringing products and services, and also seeks an injunction against further infringement. Burst.com is represented in the action against Real by San Francisco law firm Hosie – Rice, and also by Palo Alto based Carr & Ferrell, both of whom also represented Burst in its litigation against Microsoft Corporation and Apple, Inc.

Burst.com Chairman & CEO Richard Lang indicated that the company would rather not have to resort to litigation, but is committed to enforcing its patent portfolio, which was developed over a 20-year period. In its March 25th filing, Burst alleges that its technology has been essential to Real's success, providing it with a critical audio and video-on-demand media delivery solution.
